

## **Eun Mie Lim, Ph. D**

Eun Mie Lim is the director and professor of Ewha-KOICA Master's Program at the Graduate School of International Studies, Ewha Womans University. She is a development sociologist who specializes in gender and development, gender equality and women's empowerment in developing countries, international development cooperation, Asian economic development, and international migration. She received her B.A from Ewha Womans University and Master's and Doctorate degrees from the University of Washington. She teaches courses on Gender and Development, Gender Mainstreaming in Development, Development Cooperation: Theory and Practice, Korean Economic Development, and Research Methods.

She has carried out numerous researches including the evaluation of Korea's foreign aid for gender equality as well as the comparative study on the allocation of Korea and Japan's ODA for gender equality in ASEAN. Recently she completed a project that developed 'Tool-kits for mainstreaming gender in Korea's aid.' She has also conducted an extensive research on the role of remittances as effective development finance in Asia. She has been actively involved in course design and training for women leaders from developing countries in order to promote gender equality and empowerment of women.
