Students will be able to read and write on daily or social issues and understand the depth of the Korean language and the Korean people.

5. Evaluation Systems

Explanation of evaluation system:

-Test will be conducted once during the last day of classes. You will be evaluated based on your speaking, reading, and writing. For the speaking test, there will be a 1:1 interview between the student and the teacher. A written test will be given for the reading, writing portion. If you are absent on the day of the test, there will be no exceptions to retake the test. Exceptions are allowed only to those who have a formal evidence as to why they were absent.

-Students are required to attend class at least 8 times out of 12 in order to receive a grade.
