Eligibility

- Currently enrolled undergraduate or graduate students
- Korean-American who are currently residing in the United States

Benefits

- Tuition

Terms and Conditions

- The scholarship is awarded only for Korean American students from the USA who study at the International Summer School of Ewha Womans University in Seoul.
- Scholarship recipient(s) must be resident in Korea during the entire period of the International Summer School.
- All scholarship recipients are required to submit a brief written report within 30 days of the completion of their program of study.

Application

- Applicant may apply for only one of the scholarship offered by the Foundation.
- Applicant must submit: application form; official college transcripts of currently enrolled educational institution; one letter of reference; and a personal essay.
- Completed application (including all supporting documentation) must be received no later than April 5.
