- (1) Test will be conducted once during the last day of classes. You will be evaluated based on your speaking, listening, reading, and writing (4 areas). For the speaking test, there will be a 1:1 interview between the student and the teacher. A written test will be given for the reading, writing, and listening portion. If you are absent on the day of the test, there will be no exceptions to retake the test. Exceptions are allowed only to those who have a formal evidence as to why they were absent.
- (2) There will be 2 quizzes to be scheduled. The quiz accounts for 20% of the total evaluation. No makeup quizzes will be given to those who are absent.
- (3) Assignment includes homeworks, presentations and etc. which are given during class.
- (4) You are required to attend class at least 13 times out of 15 excluding Placement test & Closing Ceremony in order to receive a grade.
