1. Course Description

This course focuses on developing experiential knowledge and critical understanding of historical Korean traditional culture in dance. Students will be able to experience traditional Korean dances through <Basic Dance> and <Fan Dance>.

Korean fan dance which will be learned in this class is a representative work of traditional Korean dance. It has the characteristics of presenting the figures of birds, flowers, butterflies and waves with two large fans in each hand.
